"one who finds and defends the truth of what they know"

The apostle Paul isn't generally regarded as an apologist, however, think about it. Before he was Paul, he was Saul of Tarsus, persecuting Christians before Jesus appeared to him while on a "mission" to Damascus. Jesus appointed Paul to be an apostle to the nations and from then on, Paul became a "defender" of Christ teachings everywhere he went, the rest of his life. An example of how he did this is recorded at Acts 17:10-11 "The Bereans received the word with all eagerness, daily searching the "scriptures", whether these things were so." Think about this; the "scriptures" Paul was referring to, was the Old Testament. He reasoned with them on things already written in "scripture" from the "Old Testament" and he used that to defend what Jesus taught. The "New Testament" wouldn't be completed until the 5th century. Paul was using what was already accepted for centuries as teachings of God to reason on things Christ and His new Church taught to prove its validity. Paul became a teacher and an apologist.
